Spotlight on Leadership: Agrinatura's Participation at the RUFORUM Triennial Conference

Calls

<u>SASI-SPI</u> is establishing its <u>Advisory Committee (AC)</u> to provide advice and recommendations on the initiative's orientations, results, and strategic issues. The AC will include representatives from AGRINATURA, FAO, EC, and external members. INTPA will approve the AC's composition and names at the project's start. The AC will meet twice yearly, primarily online, with one or two face-to-face meetings. Meetings will be chaired by INTPA and facilitated by SASI-SPI's Management Unit.

DG INTPA suggests the AC consists of two groups:

- 1. Representatives of participating organisations (AN, FAO, F3).
- 2. External non-participants, primarily experts from Agrinatura and FAO.

We request suggestions for 3-4 experts from your scientific staff relevant to SASI-SPI themes, including their CVs or a webpage. VCA4D launches a call for experts for the set-up of a core group of experts on AFA and the creation of training material.

A maximum of 6 experts will be selected among economists who have already worked on VCA4D and proved interest and understanding of the AFA software. The experts will deepen their proficiency in AFA and revise and complete the guidelines on the use of AFA and the existing training materials (slides, case studies). In case needed, the group of experts will help develop new training support (e.g. tutorial videos).



[Book] Agricultural Extension and Advisory Services in Support of Climate Change Adaptation and Mitigation: An Evidence Review.

August 2024. A new evidence review highlights the significant impact of climate change on agriculture and food production globally. It underscores the need for diverse, context-specific strategies to effectively adapt to and mitigate these effects. The review examines the crucial role of agricultural extension and advisory services (EAS), provided by public, private, and civil society organizations, in promoting these strategies on a large scale. It also explores the potential for EAS to play an even greater role in these efforts. The study identifies the challenges EAS face and the support needed to enhance their contribution to climate change adaptation and mitigation. Over 500 journal articles and documents were analyzed using the innovation management framework to capture the broad range of roles EAS can perform for impactful innovation at scale. [Article] Agroecology and Youth.

"We must remember that many young people are already involved in agriculture. In the 'Global South', it is the main employer of youth, making them a key force for food systems transformation. However, their work is often informal, unstable, and underpaid. Agroecology offers numerous

opportunities for youth by linking stakeholders across the agrifood value chain and merging local knowledge with science and technology. And youth are best positioned for this holistic transformation that involves innovation and knowledge sharing. But for young people to be meaningfully involved in an agroecological transformation, we must provide them with resources, education, networks, and an enabling environment, engaging them both at the negotiating table and in the fields."
