

The EU Delegation in the Democratic Republic of Congo (RDC), represented by Filippo Saracco, has requested support from Agrinatura to enhance regional

capacity for training landscape and forest managers. Their vision involves deeper involvement from European universities in a systemic, multidisciplinary approach. They propose integrating EU students and supervisors with local staff and students through fieldwork, workshops, and seminars in RDC and Central Africa.

This initiative aligns with Agrinatura's ongoing work in the region, such as contributions to ERAIFT (a UNESCO-backed regional postgraduate school). The EU Delegation seeks collaboration with Agrinatura members to foster exchanges in landscape management, forestry, and circular economy, emphasizing practical exposure and knowledge sharing. Discussions on finance are ongoing, with backing expected from INTPA/EU Delegation.
