Current knowledge on micronutrient supplementation: policies, practices, and impacts.

Micronutrient deficiencies remain a persistent challenge, especially among pregnant women, posing risks to pregnancy outcomes and child development. This webinar will highlight the critical importance of micronutrient supplementation offering insights into global policies, evidence-based practices, and findings from recent research. Regarding the long-term effects of multiple micronutrient supplementation on child cognitive development, a recent systematic review by the NRF concludes that evidence is still lacking.

In this section, I want to share with you a set of publications that were sent by Prof Roger Leakey D.Sc., Ph.D., B.Sc., NDA to Agrinatura. He was born and brought up in Kenya and is an agricultural botanist by training, with over 400 publications. He was a former Director of Research at the International Centre for Research in Agroforestry (1993-1997); Head of Tropical Ecology at the Centre for Ecology and Hydrology in Edinburgh, UK (1997-2001), and Professor of Agroecology and Sustainable Development of James Cook University, in Cairns, Australia (2001-2006). In 2006-2008 he was a Coordinating Lead Author in the International Assessment of Agricultural Science and Technology for Development. He is a Vice President of the International Tree Foundation.
